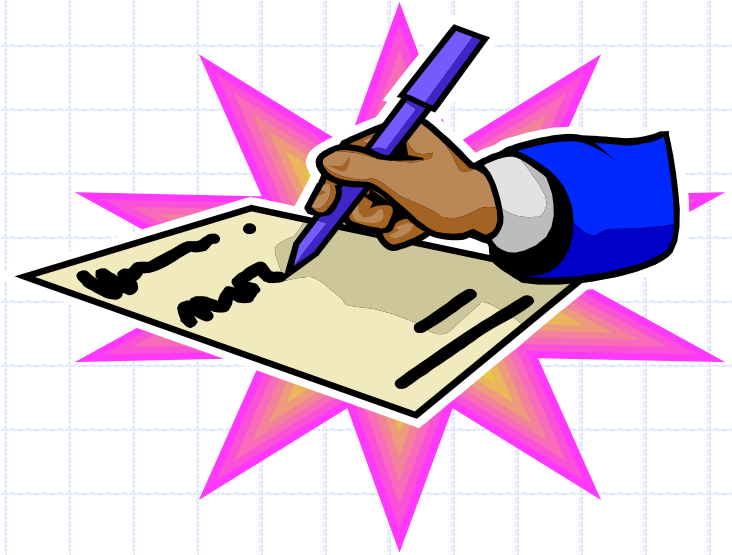

- ◆ To inform reader about other possible information sources

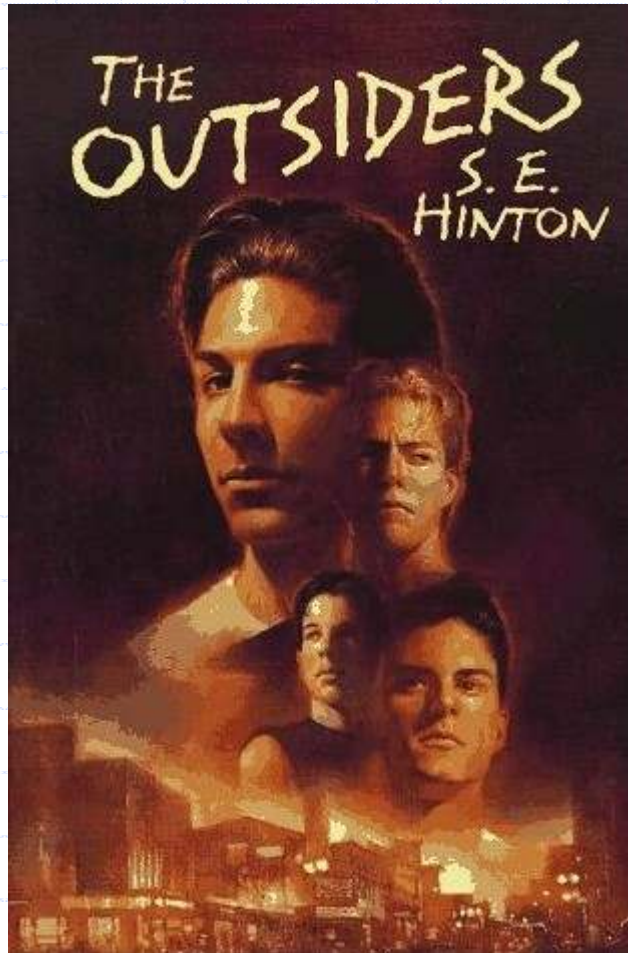
What is plagiarism?
